Imam Khomeini's Message to the Iranian Nation on the Threshold of the First Presidential Elections from the Hospital

In the Name of God, the Merciful, the Compassionate

I just want to talk about two things. First, about my health, which is, praise be to God, not bad. Perhaps my physicians and the Minister of Health fuss over me too much, which I'm not used to.

lam glad to hear that these authorities intend to pay attention to these slum-dwellers in the cities and these tent-dwellers of the cities to whom no attention was paid in the time of the Taghut [former regime of the Shah.] Health facilities which are at the top of the list of all necessities should be so that all people can enjoy these facilities and not so that some people can enjoy excessive health facilities while others have none available to them at all. I hope that the physicians, wherever they might be, and the government and the Minister of Health, and the nation itself will take note of this point, so that these slum-dwellers and the poor, who are among those loved by God will not be afflicted with these problems.

This was one thing - the second thing is that, tomorrow is I riday, 'an auspicious day in an auspicious month, the noble birthday of the honorable Prophet | Muhammad (). It is auspicious because our nation will achieve another of her wishes: the election of the president. In this respect I have some points to make which if fulfilled would make

me happy, and my ill-health not very important.

One point is that tomorrow all the people should go to the polling stations. Do not be apathetic in face of such an important issue for the country. The destiny of the nation and Islam depends on it. The situation should not arise that a candidate for the post of president gives up, regarding his chances of being elected as very slim, and his friends consequently would not vote. It would be better for those candidates who know they are unlikely to be elected to support whom they think likely to be elected, so that, God willing, enough votes will be achieved and we will not be ashamed because our nation takes no interest in her fate and the fate of Islam. Altogether go to the polling stations!

The other point is that, when you go to the ballot boxes, you should not quarrel. It is the country's interests at stake. Should any of these candidates be elected, he will be serving the country and if he does not, then the nation is present and will depose him. Therefore, do not treat each other in a hostile way. Be brothers to one another. If one should be elected president then help him. You should not squabble, and fight with each other tomorrow (the election day.) It should not be that some strata do not participate in the elections. I ask all strata of the nation whether Fars, Turk, Kurd, Baluch, Turkman, Bakhtiari or from the

other tribes in fran, I beg them humbly; not to act in a way that people abroad will consider you without Islamic courtesy as a people who fight with each other over material matters. The presidency is not something to be considered unimportant. Should the president be good the will serve the people and should he be bad, he will pave the way to hell.


Do not quarrel and fight only for one to gain more votes than the other and thus make me set and dissatisfied here in the hospital.
